Dear People of St. Paul's,

In the months of August and September, you and I will have the chance to see each other face-to-face, and you will meet me for the first time. I will be seeing you for the first time, too, but I began to get to know you many years ago because my colleague Frank was always so happy to share his love of St. Paul's with his clergy friends. I already know how much love and talent lies in your community; I know that the laity of the church are gifted ministers. I also know that you know how to have fun; I've seen Frank and Chuck do a soft shoe routine, and your children sing a beautiful song. Friendly laughter and loud applause followed both performances on the home movie footage Frank shared with me. I'm looking forward to learning even more about the love, strengths and gifts of St. Paul's as we begin our relationship as Priest and People during the Interim time which will ultimately lead to a new Rector for St. Paul's.

Here are some things to know about me and my life as a Christian and a Priest:

First, I'm no stranger to New England; I'm a graduate of Smith College and Yale Divinity School, and I've spent ten years of my ministry as the Episcopal Chaplain at Boston University and the last two years of my ministry as a Diocesan Interim Priest. While at B.U., I also served as the founder and director of The Micah Project, a 9 month program of service and vocational discernment for recent college graduates. During my tenure as director, I led 36 young adult interns into urban parishes, peace and justice programs, and chaplaincies where they contributed over 2,560 hours of service per year. During my years of ordained ministry, I've also served parishes and chaplaincies in Washington, D.C., Princeton, New Jersey, and New Haven, CT. I served as an Assistant Minister at Trinity Church, Princeton, N.J., and worked as the Assistant Chaplain at Princeton University.. At each of these parishes, I've had a special interest in fostering excellent adult education programs.

I've been an ordained Episcopal Priest for sixteen years, and in the last nine of these years, I've been married to, Jon, who is an active member of the Unitarian Church. We have a son, Benjamin, six, who plans to participate in the St. Paul's Church School, and we have four older children, Rachel, Asa, Jonas, and Rebecca, my step children, who are Unitarians. This year Rebecca will graduate from Colorado College. During family free time, you will find us skiing in the White Mountains, sailing and swimming in ocean water, and hiking around New England.

"Behold," says the Christ, "I make all things new!"

When I'm asked about my favorite quotation from scripture, I always hold up Christ's promise to make all things new. One of the reasons I follow Jesus is because in both the joys and sorrows of this life, I witness the resurrection and redemption Christ brings us. Christ calls us to practice resurrection by staying open to the beauty and sacredness of our own lives, and by keeping our hearts open to "the new things" being done around us, whether they be in our children, our friends, our partners, or the stranger down the street. I welcome the opportunity to join you for another "new thing" – the chance to prepare our hearts for this year's journey of interim time.

I am looking forward to being spiritual pilgrims together as we celebrate the good work underway and reflect together on what God is calling St.Paul's to become in the second decade of the 21st Century. Godspeed to each of us in our journey, Margaret
