Dear Friends,

I always loved September. Since I was a child, September meant getting together with my friends again even though over the summer months I saw them almost every day. There was always something special about coming together to go to school. For me, it was about gathering in community with a different purpose than we gather in the summer.

I would never forfeit the rest, relaxation and leisure that the summer months usually offer, but I would also never forfeit that time of returning to the community of friends to be together in a new way.

I am in an advent mode today, waiting to see all those who have been away, to hear their stories of summer and see the excitement they bring back from their days of rest, relaxation and fun. I anticipate the reconnections we will make as our community gathers again to worship together, play together and do God's work in the world together as a community, a congregation of God's people.

By example, Jesus has showed us many times the need to get away, to row a boat, eat on the beach, sit around talking to friends. We so often reserve this for a few months in the summer. The model of Jesus doing this is a sign for us to do the same all the time.

I hope that during this program year we find many ways both in the church and in our community to do the same. Find ways to continue the invitation to enjoy each other in community- to experience the relaxation that rowing about offers, to enjoy and engage in the fellowship that eating on the beach offers, and to be enriched by the voices and ideas exchanged by friends.

I hope that this year brings a renewed experience of prayer and we understand that all we do and say is prayer. I hope that as we gather and live together in the joy of this St. Paul's Community that prayer is seen as the center of our lives together. I hope that as we look at our simple and sometimes complex daily routines we imagine that it is all prayer; it is all in response to God's hope in us. Even as we wash our faces, walk on the tread mill, mow, rake, rock a baby, knit, read, dream-we are praying. All we do belongs to God. All we do is a prayer. Sometimes reciting words of our conversation with God is helpful; sometimes reading portions of Scripture is helpful; sometimes reading the Prayer Book is helpful. There is no one way to pray. There is no one better way than another to pray. God loves it all! God loves it when we stay in touch.

Praying was also part of Jesus' life and sometimes when he went off alone it was for prayer as well as rest. When he gathered with his friends and the thousands that came to see and hear him, I am sure he had great pleasure in socializing as well. That's the community we represent when we gather at any time. We represent the community that Jesus formed around himself. It was a community of hope, prayer, vision, compassion and joy. That's who we are at St. Paul's and I am so glad to be with you as you gather together again.

Catechesis Corner



Although it is still summer, we are starting to prepare for the new church school year. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is our program for children aged three through Kindergarten. It is very "hands on" with only short presentations and plenty of choices of activities and materials to work with. We have found over several years that almost all children enjoy it and learn more about the church than one might expect at this young age. All who will be three (or close, we're flexible) by September are very welcome.

We generally follow the same calendar as the rest of the Church School. This year this means that we will have registration for families after church on September 7th, and the first class for children (which will be an orientation to their rooms or 'atria') on September 14th. We expect to have two classes, though this, and the division of ages, will depend on the number of children who register. If parents, especially from families new to St. Paul's, could contact Amanda Hubbard (781-275-7857; hubbard[at]psfc.mit.edu) ahead of time with names that would be a big help. She or Ellen Ryan would be very happy to answer any questions about the program.

We are also looking for volunteers to teach in the classes – both lead teachers who prepare the lessons, and the all-important assistants who help keep each class running safely and smoothly. Youth (sixth grade and up), parents, and other members of the congregation are all invited to help. It is a great way to find out what goes on in the classroom and meet the children, and the schedule is very flexible. Again, please contact Amanda.

Elementary Sunday School

Other events for the coming year that are in the planning stages include the following:


- Annual Brunch March 2009 (any volunteers to host the brunch this year?)
