Dear Friends.

On Sunday the 18th we heard the story of Creation as told by the writers of Genesis. I shared it with the children and the rest of the congregation that day. I only discussed the working part of God's work. I told what God *did* on each day. What I did not discuss and should have was what God did on the day when the work was done. This is what God did - God rested. God stopped doing and started resting, relaxing and enjoying what was done. I was told many years ago by a theology professor of the Hebrew Scriptures that God **created** rest. Just like all the gifts of creation God also gives us the gift of rest.

Yes! This is the annual message about going too fast, going too long, being busier and busier and believing somehow that that is what is good. Somehow we believe that the harder we work, the longer our day and the better we are. Everything indicates otherwise. We become overtired. Perhaps, we become irritable. Maybe we don't pay enough attention to those around us. We don't value rest as much as we should. It seems we spend a lot of time talking about needing it. And yet it is there for the taking. God gave it to us. God modeled it for us.

The spring and the fall invite us into the idea of rest. Perhaps it's because of the weather or the beauty of the earth that is so vibrant. Perhaps the invitation to be outdoors with one another or alone sometimes gives us permission to take more time for ourselves. It is easier to travel in summer unencumbered by the weather of winter and the weight of clothing we have to carry for comfort.

I know many of us are thinking about vacation, time away from the ordinary patterns of our lives. It is a good thing to ponder and a better thing to do. I hope everyone takes time either at home or away to dream new dreams, play new games, gather around grills and lakes and oceans. I hope everyone has some time to just rest. Copy God!

I wonder if God walked around on that day and just observed what was emerging in creation. I wonder if God sat and dreamed about the possibilities of life and creation begun in the work. I wonder if God touched the water, basked in the sunlight, caressed the animals and smiled at the birds of the air. I wonder if God looked, just looked, and let it all be a gift. That is what we should do in our rest. Notice all the gifts God has given and continues to give us. Notice the love we receive from our families and friends and the joy we receive from the creation around us.

Enjoy these days. I hope they are not reserved just for summer months. I hope we can hold onto the gift of time that God has given us. I hope the gift of rest, created from the start, is something we use in every season.

NEWS FROM ST. PAUL'S WEEKDAY NURSERY SCHOOL



Gaining Ground



Gaining Ground is a non-profit organization that operates 9 acres of farmland at 315 Virginia Road in Concord, MA. The farm grows 100% organic vegetables and fruit with the help of volunteers and donates all of this fresh produce to shelters, food pantries, meal programs, and other hunger-relief programs throughout Greater Boston and Eastern Massachusetts. With an operating budget of \$130,000 the farm grows approximately 20,000 pounds of produce each year. Some local meal programs estimate that they save \$1,000 a month when the farm's produce is available. In addition to providing the produce, Gaining Ground offers volunteers the opportunity to learn about organic agriculture techniques and the local environment.

Our plans for St. Paul's to help with gardening at Gaining Ground are still in the works. Our June 1 date is cancelled. Stay tuned for announcements about how you can help.


